4. Provost's Report: David Quigley, Provost and Dean of Faculties

Billy discussed a mid-semester feedback forthat will be available this fall. Use of the feedback form is optional. There will be two standard questions, and faculty will have the option to add three questions which they can create themselves or choose from a question bank. The forms will be launched to students during the first week of Octaberresults will be available to faculty the following week. The results will be accessible to the faculty member and responses will be anonymous.

David expressed appreciation for the extraordinary work that has been done across campus over the past six months to prepare for the fall. Approximately of the University's classes are meeting in person in some manner this fall, and the semester is off to a good start. There are ongoing conversations about the emerging plans for the spring semester. The virus will dictate much of how things play out, but the hope is for something resembling lessemester with some continued expansionin-person experiences he spring academic calendaremains unchanged at this point, but some flexibility may be required to ensure the health of the community.

He continued with some updates:
